

Author Guidelines

Tablets & Capsules Magazine (T&C) welcomes contributions from experts in formulation, production, and packaging of solid dosage forms, including pharmaceutical companies, regulatory authorities, industry suppliers, and consultants for possible publication in the bi/monthly print issues, supplements, ebooks, or online at www.tabletscapsules.com. All submissions are reviewed and edited by the editor; final publication is coordinated by the editor.

CONTENT: T&C features content for professionals interested in unbiased and applicable information. All articles submitted to T&C must be original and unique, having not been published elsewhere (print or online). All submissions are screened for plagiarism, including self-plagiarism. No more than 10% of your article should be derived or created by a generative AI tool and this should be disclosed to the editor upon submission. Articles should be written in English.

All articles must be unbiased (with no mention of specific vendor companies or product names). Authors may refer to individual products/processes generically if it is essential to support the technical content of the text.

DOCUMENT FORMAT: Microsoft Word

FIGURES/GRAPHS: Articles may include a maximum of 5 figures, graphs, or photographs. Images should be supplied as high-resolution (300 dpi); jpg, pdf, or tiff files. Tables, charts/graphs should be submitted as editable files in their source program (Word/Excel/PowerPoint). Authors should indicate proper placement of figures within an article by pasting a copy of the figure in the appropriate place in the body of the text. Figures and graphs should also be cited in the text in the order in which they appear.

LENGTH: Article length may vary by feature type.

- Feature articles may run 1,200-2,500 words, depending on subject and scope.
- “Back Page” and “Ask an Expert” run 600-800 words.
- “Product Feature” submissions should run 200-400 words.

EDITING: The publisher reserves the right to edit any article as necessary while retaining its original meaning or context.

AUTHOR INFORMATION

Biography: A brief (50-75 words) biography should be included for all authors. A print-quality photograph of the author(s) may be submitted as desired. Digital photographs should be high-resolution at a minimum 2” x 2” size.

Co-Authors: Co-authors may not be employed at vendor companies, nor are employees of vendor companies permitted to be acknowledged anywhere in the text. Authors may list co-authors from a different organization or company only by permission from T&C.

SUBMISSION PROCESS & EDITORIAL CONTACT

Articles should be submitted via e-mail as a Microsoft Word attachment. Please include date submitted [MM/DD/YYYY], author names, job titles, and affiliations at the beginning of the document. Articles must be submitted with both a full title and a shortened title (approximately 50 characters).

REFERENCES

Authors are responsible for the validity, accuracy, and completeness of their references and for correct text citation. References in the Reference List should be listed in the order in which they appear in the text, and cited according to American Medical Association (AMA) style. References should be identified with superscript Arabic numeral citations *outside* periods and commas, and *inside* colons and semicolons. Authors must ensure that each reference cited in the text is also present in the Reference List (and vice versa). Cited authors' names should be inverted, and use initials (with no periods) for first and middle names. List all authors and/or editors up to 6; if more than 6, list the first 3 followed by "et al." **Do not include hyperlinks within the text or references.**
